FROM THE STATE TREASURER

One big item to get started right off the bat, PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE make sure you complete your 990s. Each and every LO is required to complete a 990-EZ form. If you need the LO tax number or help, please let me know. There is a step-by-step instructions in the Members Only section of the website.

While there is no penalty assessment for filing Form 990-N late, organizations that fail to file required Forms 990, 990-EZ or 990-N for three consecutive years will automatically lose their tax-exempt status. Revocation of the organization's tax-exempt status will happen on the filing due date of the third consecutively-missed year. Even though IFBWC does not have tax-exempt status, some LOs do. If those LOs lose their status, it will cost \$600.00 and a lot of paper work to re-instate the LO. Don't let this happen!!!

We're pleased to tell you we determined you're exempt from federal income tax under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 501(c)(6). This letter could help resolve questions on your exempt status. Please keep it for your records.

Based on the information you submitted in your application, we approved your request for reinstatement under Revenue Procedure 2014-11. Your effective date of exemption, as listed at the top of this letter, is retroactive to your date of revocation.

Our records show you were previously tax exempt as a subordinate under group exemption number 1913. Because you applied for and were granted your own individual tax-exempt status, you no longer rely on your affiliation with a parent organization for recognition of your tax exemption.

If, in the future, you choose to become a subordinate under a group ruling, you'll lose your individual recognition of tax-exempt status. Moreover, if you become a subordinate under a group ruling and your parent organization loses its tax-exempt status, you also will lose your exempt status. To reestablish your individual tax exemption after rejoining a group exemption, you'll be required to reapply and pay the appropriate user fee.

If we indicated at the top of this letter that you're required to file Form 990/990-EZ/990-N, our records show you're required to file an annual information return (Form 990 or Form 990-EZ) or electronic notice (Form 990-N, thee-Postcard). If you don't file a required return or notice for three consecutive years, your exempt status will be automatically revoked.

If we indicated at the top of this letter that an addendum applies, the enclosed addendum is an integral part of this letter.

CLINTON LO REPORT

2019 An attempt to save history.

At this recent State Convention, as the only member of Clinton BWC present, I received an award on behalf of a local that is over 90 years old. A local that held a disbandment vote on March 27, 2019 that failed by just one vote. This vote left the local with only two remaining members. I thought it was incumbent on me to meet with the only other member to discuss any options that might be open to us as we were making the attempt to save this 90 year old local.

During that meeting we both agreed on a plan that could get members, at least in the short term. When I first mentioned that Clinton BWC was planning to disband to Catherine Barbercheck, she first off gave me plenty of support in how to do the disbandment properly; and then when that vote failed she offered to be a dual member of the Clinton local. As I briefed the State President Carol Burk and President Elect Cherie Kessler about the failed vote, I mentioned that Catherine had offered to become a dual member to help our membership numbers. Now current State President Cherie Kessler also agreed to become a dual member of the Clinton local ALSO. I do understand that dual membership isn't a permanent solution for our membership issues, but it does give us a small amount of time to recruit new regular members.

Then came the new by-laws change allowing 80+ year old members to belong to a local without paying dues. I thought, okay, Clinton has a pretty good size pool of past local Presidents who have spent many years as members of Clinton BPW. Why not ask them if they would like to return as members of the local again? This also would be a temporary way to increase membership, and give us a little more time to increase our membership with regular members. The dual members and the past local Presidents would also be fantastic mentors for a whole group of new members for this local.

Thirty six years ago I became a member of Clinton BPW and was immediately placed in a position of learning to become a leader. A leader in my local, a leader in my district, a leader on the BPW state board and most recently being a leader as an alternate membership representative for the second time. I really believe that in all my years as a BPW/ BWC member I have had some of the best mentors that anyone could have.

Maybe I am a little on the weird side, but I thought it was pretty cool to be sitting by Jean McCarrey (a Past National President) at a Leadership Conference, and learning from her and the presenter the proper way to become a local organization President. As an aside, I was such a new member I had no idea who Ms. McCarrey was other than the nice lady who was so kind to show me the things I needed to know to become a great local organization President. Think for a little while about all those who provided you with the skills you have to be a great leader for your local and for the state federation.

Now after 36 years I have a whole bunch of mentors, and hopefully I can pass along the things I have learned from all of them. If we all pass along what we have learned to new young members it could be a great way to keep our locals going on into the future.

I just have never felt that it was a terrific idea to just throw a brand new member into a job in the local when they don't know what they are getting into. They get overwhelmed and give up because no one took the time to mentor them on the proper way to do whatever job they have. It just shortens the time that they stay in and we lose a great contributing member.

If you want to turn a new member into a great leader give them some really great mentors and your reward will be a really great leader. Give them the time they need to learn the skills, don't just elect them President of the local right off the bat. Let them see that with a little bit of time they can also learn to be a great leader like the person that takes the time to be their mentor.

Recruiting new members for the Clinton local will be a little daunting at first—sort of like starting a new local. But I feel it is well worth the time that Beth and I take to help a younger generation of women to fight the battles such as pay equity, equal rights for all women in the United States, and many other issues that will indeed come to face women today and in the future.

A lesson I learned a long time ago from one of my first mentors, Merna Tucker, was, “It pays to belong to BPW “and I have gained a great many things from my membership in BPW/BWC. So Merna was right all along, it does pay to belong to BWC. I have a great job and a great friends because of my BPW/ BWC experiences.

It is up to all of us to make it pay to belong to BWC, to make the experiences in BWC something that a new young member would want to have. Because they will want to know “What’s in it for me.” to belong to BWC in the first place. The organization just has to find a way to present its self as a valuable experience that the younger women can feel a part of and gain something from the local and the state federation. Let them find their “What’s in it for me in BWC, then both BWC and the new young members can work together to make a difference in the lives of women into the future. TAYLORVILLE LO REPORT


